Updates on Township Hall

As this newsletter goes to print, decisions on the new Township Hall are still in process. Progressive AE was hired to provide a civil engineering analysis, which included a drone flyover on April 28. The drone flew about 200-300 feet above the ground and took 500 photos which will be digitally connected to provide topographical information needed to continue planning for the hall.
