Parking Lot Requirement at Proposed Township Hall

The Township Board requested that the PC look at the parking lot requirements that will determine how many paved spots will be required at the proposed Township Hall. Nic read aloud the pertinent portions of the Zoning Ordinance and gave the opinion that the PC can make that determination based upon expected usage, etc. Although a formal vote was not held, everyone was in agreement that paving a minimum of 25 spaces, three of which would be handicap accessible, would be acceptable, if the remaining parking lot is done with limestone or something similar. The entire lot should contain 75 parking spaces. The PC will review the entire site plan when it is available.
